

Get Started!

There are three main reasons why students benefit from taking online classes with VTVLC:

1. **Availability:** Many schools have to decide on what courses they will be able to offer, based on the faculty employed in their school. It can be difficult to cover all of the core academics, let alone broader academics, Advanced Placement, and elective courses. Vermont Virtual provides students with a greater availability to courses, offered by teachers throughout Vermont.
2. **Accessibility:** At larger schools, course catalogs can contain numerous offerings for students. However, if those courses are offered at the same time as a core academic course that is a graduation requirement, then the student has to make a difficult decision about which course to take. Enrolling in an online course, allows the student to benefit from the unique options available at their school.
3. **Flexibility:** Not all students learn the same way, at the same time. Because VTVLC courses can be scheduled into the student's day at any time, students are free to work on their courses at times that makes the most sense for them. We find that students can be much more successful with this type of flexibility in scheduling.

Flexible solutions for your education needs



What is it like taking an online course?

The amount of work is the same, or more, than your traditional classes. The difference is that you have much more flexibility. In most cases, the amount of work you do is tied to weekly assignments and not daily.

Do I have a teacher, or am I working totally on my own?

You have a Vermont teacher who works with you. Your teacher grades assignments, provides feedback on work and is available to talk to during the week in "online office hours". Telephone calls, Skype, texting and discussion forums allow you to keep in touch with your teacher.

Are all of my tests and quizzes online?


Yes, but you also will have "Discussion Based Assessments" or "DBA"s. These are opportunities for you to talk with your teacher and demonstrate what you know!

What is the schedule for the online courses?

Currently, all of our courses are tied to the school year. This means Fall courses begin the end of August, and end in mid-January. The Spring semester begins in mid-January and ends the beginning of June. Each semester, there are two floating-week vacations to allow for flexibility in your schedule!
