- We offer activities and new experiences focused on student skill development, exploration, and opportunities for mastery in a safe, structured environment;

- We help students improve academic outcomes in literacy, math, and other core subjects;

- We build student social skills & emotional learning by modeling cooperative grouping & problem solving techniques;

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

Kingdom Afterschool serves a large number of CNSU students:

- Caledonia North Supervisory Union has offered low cost & free afterschool programming to K-8 students since 2008 at:
 - **Burke Town School**
 - **Lyndon Town School**
 - **Miller's Run School**
 - **Newark Street School**
 - **Sutton Village School**
- 449 students participated in 2013-14 – over 50% of CNSU K-8 students;

Kingdom Afterschool provides a wide range of program offerings:


- **Five sessions per year, 4-8 weeks each session;**
- Hands-on, project based learning designed to promote connections to schools & communities;
- Programs led by school day teachers/ staff and “expert” guest instructors from the community;
- Daily homework help, small group & individual tutoring by teachers at each site;
- Special events, field trips, and participation in state-wide competitions and events;
- **No charge for middle school clubs; No charge for students who are eligible for free or reduced school meals;**
- **NEW USDA Expanded Snack Programs at Burke, Lyndon and Newark; USDA is an Equal Opportunity Provider;**

FUNDING:

- 2013 – Awarded third five year 21st Century Community Learning Center grant by VT Agency of Education; provides 45% of program revenue;
- CNSU schools provide funding through local school budgets (36%) and Title I Consolidated Federal Program dollars (16%);
- Fees charged to families provide 3% of program income;
- Support received from CNSU schools, community organizations & individuals through in-kind staffing & donations.
